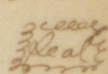
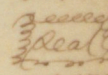
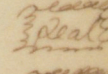
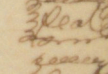
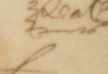


defend against all persons claiming any right title or interest under the said Truities, their heirs or successors.

And further this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Samuel S. Snyder Joel Grover, John S. Wood, William H. R. Lykins & George W. Hutchinson and their successors are held and firmly bound unto the said Henry S. McClelland in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, to be paid unto the said Henry S. McClelland his heirs or assigns, to which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves and our successors by these presents. Now the condition of this obligation is such that if, upon the payment by the said party of the second part of all taxes lawfully assessed upon the aforesaid premises, the said parties of the first part or their successors shall make and deliver unto the said party of the second part his heirs or assigns, a good and valid Deed, with the usual covenants for conveyance in fee simple, whenever a patent for the Town Site of Lawrence, shall issue from Congress unto one Robert Hobbs, or William H. R. Lykins, to be conveyed unto the said Truities then this obligation shall be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force.
