D. Searl, A. D. - 1854 - to wit: - Lots number one hundred and sixty four (164) New York Street, Lots one hundred and twelve (112) and one hundred and fourteen (114) Pennsylvania Street. —

And I, Jacob E. Strout aforesaid, my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, are held and firmly bound by these presents, in the sum of One Hundred Dollars to Absalam W. White aforesaid, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, to well and truly make over and convey unto him or them all the title which I shall receive from the Trustees of the said Town of Lawrence, or from any power, or person or persons whomsoever, to any and all of the above described property, to have and to hold the same with all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging forever. —

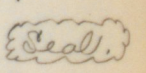
