

Know all men by these Presents, that I Robert Morrow of the Town of Lawrence, Territory of Kansas, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred and Sixty Dollars, to me in hand paid by Henry Campbell of the Town aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold and quit claimed and by these presents do bargain sell and quit claim unto the said Campbell, his heirs, executors administrators and assigns, forever, all my right, title, interest, claim and demand in and to the following described land, situate and lying in the Town of Lawrence, in the Territory of Kansas, according to the survey made by A. D. Searl A. D. 1854, to wit:—

Lot number One (1) Massachusetts Street.  
And I, Robert Morrow aforesaid my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns are held and firmly bound by these Presents, in the sum of Six Hundred Dollars to H. Campbell aforesaid, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, to well and truly make over and convey unto him or them all the title which I shall receive from the Trustees of the said Town of Lawrence, or from any power, or person or persons whomsoever, to any and all of the above described property, to have and to hold the same with all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging forever.
