Hanscom his heirs or assigns shall convey unto the said W. S. Storrs his heirs or assigns whatever further title may or shall be unto the said Oliver A. Hanscom conveyed by the Trustees of the Town Site of Lawrence said Territory, or by or from any person or persons whomsoever, or by any power whatsoever, by virtue of a Patent issuing from the Land Office at Washington, unto one William H. P. Lykins, or one Robert Robitaille, a Wyandott Indian, or by virtue of any other authority: at such time as said title shall be to him conveyed, then this obligation shall be wholly void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force.
