Pellett of the Town aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold and quit-claimed, and by these presents do bargain, sell and quit-claim unto the said Walter S. Pellett, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, forever all my right, title, interest, claim and demand, in and to the following described land, situate and lying in the Town of Lawrence in the Territory of Kansas, according to the survey made by A. D. Searl, A. D. 1854, to-wit:-

Lot number Forty Six (46) on Connecticut Street.
And I, Philip H. Woodward, aforesaid my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, are held and firmly bound by these presents in the sum of Seventy dollars to Walter S. Pellett, aforesaid, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns are to, make over and convey unto him or them well and truly all the title which I shall receive from the Trustees of the said Town of Lawrence, or from any power, or person or persons whomsoever, to any and all of the above described property. To have and to hold the same with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, forever. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Twenty Fifth day of July A.D. 1856.
