bargained, sold and quit claimed, and by these presents do  
bargain, sell and quit claim unto the said Mrs Elizabeth S.  
Whitney, her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, forever,  
all very right, title, interest, claim and demand in and to the  
following described land situate and lying in the Town of  
Lawrence, in the Territory of Kansas, according to the survey  
made by A. D. Searl, A. D. 1854, to - wit:-

Lots number (78, 80, 81) Seventy eight, eighty and eighty two of  
Street. And Samuel N. Wood, aforesaid, his heirs, executors,  
administrators and assigns, are held and firmly bound by  
these presents, in the sum of two hundred dollars to ~~the~~ Mrs Elizabeth S.  
Whitney, aforesaid, her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns,  
to well and truly make over and convey unto him or them all the  
title which he shall receive from the Trustees of the said Town of  
Lawrence, or from any power, or person or persons whomsoever  
to any and all of the above described property. To Have and  
Hold the same with all the privileges and appurtenances there-  
unto belonging, forever.
