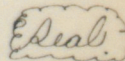

Searl, of the Town of Lawrence, State of Kansas, for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Turner Sampson, of aforesaid place, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained sold, and quit-claimed and by these presents do bargain, sell and quit-claim unto the said Turner Sampson, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, all my right, title, interest, claim and demand, in and to the following described land, situate and lying in the Town of Lawrence, in the State of Kansas, according to the survey made by A. D. Searl, A. D. 1854, to-wit:-

Lot No. One hundred and fifty eight (158) One hundred and sixty (160) Louisiana Street.

And I, A. D. Searl, aforesaid, my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns are held and firmly bound ^{by these presents} in the sum of Two hundred dollars to said Turner Sampson, aforesaid, his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns to well and truly make over and convey unto him or them all the title which I shall receive from the Trustees of the said Town of Lawrence, or from any power, or person or persons whomsoever, to any and all of the above described property, To Have and To Hold the same with all the privileges and appurtenances therunto belonging, forever.
