

This Indenture, made this second day of June A. D. 1855, between Samuel S. Snyder, Joel Grover, John P. Hood, William H. R. Lykins & George W. Hutchinson, Trustees of the Town Site of Lawrence, Kansas Territory, parties of the first part, and Joel K. Goodin, party of the second part: Witnesseth, that in compliance with the provisions contained in the Deed in Trust from one William H. R. Lykins, to the above Trustees creating said Trustees, and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid by said Joel K. Goodin, of said Town and Territory, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have conveyed, released, and quit claimed, and by these presents do convey, release and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all right, title, and interest in and to certain lots of land situated and being in Lawrence, First Council District, Kansas Territory, and designated on the Lithographed Chart as surveyed by A. D. Searl, October, A. D. 1854, as follows, to-wit: - Share number one hundred fifty one (151) containing lots as follows, Massachusetts Street, ninety seven, (97) New Hampshire Street, fifty seven (57) - Vermont Street one hundred eight (108). Louisiana Street, one hundred sixty three (163) Mississippi Street one hundred sixty five (165) - Connecticut Street, one hundred thirty one (131) Mississippi Street, two hundred twenty two (222) New Jersey Street one hundred twenty six (126) Illinois Street, two hundred eighty six (286) and two hundred eighty eight (288) Pennsylvania Street, one hundred thirty eight, (138) and lot New Hampshire Street thirty five (35).

To Have and to Hold the aforesaid quit claimed premises with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the said party of the second part, so that neither we, said Trustees, our heirs, or successors, or any person claiming by, from or under us or them, shall have any right, title, interest, claim or demand in or to the aforesaid premises or any part thereof, and we hereby covenant and agree to warrant and defend against all persons
