Hall, her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, all my right, title, interest, claims and demand in and to the following described land situate and lying in the City of Lawrence in the Territory of Kansas to-wit: Lot number one hundred and eighty-four (184) on New Hampshire Street, according to survey and plan made by A. D. Searl, Oct A.D. 1854, being the same lot purchased of Otis Potter as by his deed of even date herewith will appear. And the said George W. Hunt, my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns are held and firmly bound by these presents in the sum of one hundred dollars to the said Lydia S. Hall, her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns to well and truly make over and convey unto her or them a good and valid title such as the said George W. Hunt shall receive from the Trustees of the City of Lawrence to any and all of the above described property.
