D. 1850, before the subscriber, a Commissioner, int<sup>d</sup> and for said State, appointed by the Governor of Kansas Territory, to take the acknowledgement and proofs of the execution of Deeds and other conveyances, or Leases, and of any Contract, Letter of Attorney, or any other writing, under seal or not, administer oaths, and take and certify depositions, to be used and recorded in the said Kansas Territory, appeared Louis W. Pfeif and Elizabeth Pfeif, his wife, described in, and who executed the annexed instrument of writing between themselves, as one of the parties thereto and John Muller, the other party thereto, and the said Louis W. Pfeif and Wife acknowledged that they executed the said instrument freely, for the purpose therein stated.

Pfeif, on being made acquainted with the contents thereof by me, and on a private examination, apart from her husband, acknowledged that she execr'd the said instrument of writing freely, and without any fear or compulsion of her said husband or any other person.
