paid to the said Hunt his executors administrators & assigns  
for which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves  
our heirs executors & administrators & each of them firmly by  
these presents. Sealed with our seal. Dated the seventeenth day  
of October One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty seven.  
The condition of this obligation is such that if the above  
bounden obligors shall make execute & deliver unto the said  
Hunt (provided & when the said Hunt shall pay to the  
said obligors a certain promissory note dated on the day of  
the date of this instrument for the sum of One Hundred  
Dollars payable in sixty days from date with five per  
cent interest a month until paid) a quit claim deed of all  
that certain parcel of land in said Lawrence known as lot  
number seventeen in Massachusetts Street then this obligation  
to be void. otherwise to remain in full force.
