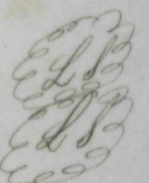
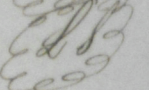


"Brought forward"

 same unto the said Liniback his heirs and assigns forever, against
 the lawful claims and demands of all persons, claiming by wrong
 or under us but against none other - And we the said Barilla P.
 and Maria our heirs executors, and administrators are held and firmly
 bound by these presents in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars to the
 said Alfred S. Liniback his heirs and assigns, to make and convey
 unto him or them, all further right or title which shall or may
 be awarded to ~~me~~ or conveyed to us by any authority, or by any
 person or persons, by virtue of a title to the Town site of Lawrence,
 aforesaid issuing from the General Land Office - In Witness whereof
