Pinkney Street - thence running in a South westerly direction
along the line of the ravine fifty eight & one third feet to a
stake which marks the south East corner of the lot herein conveyed
thence on the line of Pinkney Street to the place of beginning
with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging
