 with all the buildings thereon - To have and to hold the above released
 premises with all the privileges and appurtenances to the same belonging
 to the said Eldridge his heirs and assigns to his & theirs use and behoof
 forever, and the said Company for themselves and their successors do
 covenant with the said Eldridge his heirs and assigns that the premises
 are free from all Encumbrance made or suffered by said Company
 and that they will and their successors shall warrant and defend
 the same to the said Eldridge his heirs and assigns forever against
 the lawful claims and demands of all persons claiming by through
 or under the said Company but against none other In witness
 whereof the said Company by the hands of Charles J. Higginson
 their Treasurer hereunto duly authorized have hereunto set
 their seal this Eleventh day of November in the year of our Lord
 One thousand Eight hundred and fifty seven and at the same
 time caused these presents to be signed by said Treasurer
