Samuel Try for myself and my
heirs Executors and Administrators do
covenant with the said Thomas Try and
his heirs and assigns that the said
premises are free from all encumbrances
made or suffered by me; that I have
full right and power to sell convey and
quit claim the same, and that I and they
shall and will warrant and defend the
same unto the said Thomas Try and unto
his heirs and assigns forever, against the
lawful claims and demands of all persons
claiming by through or under me but against
none other. And I the said Samuel Try
and my heirs Executors and Administrators
am held and firmly bound by these presents
in the sum of Twenty thousand Dollars
to the said Thomas Try and unto his
heirs and assigns, to make and convey
unto him or them all further right or
title which shall or may be awarded or
conveyed to me by any authority or by any person
or persons by virtue of a title to the town site
of Laurier aforesaid issuing from the General
