But if default be made in the payment of the said promissory note for One hundred and twelve Dollars in any part thereof, as above provided, then it shall be lawful for the said parties of the second part his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted, in any part thereof in the manner prescribed by law; and out of all the moneys arising from such sale, to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with the costs and charges of making such sale and the attorneys fees for the same, and the surplus if any then due shall be paid by the parties making such sale on demand to the said parties of the first part their heirs or assigns.
