This grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of five hundred and ninety three dollars the purchase money, according to the conditions of a certain promissory note, this day executed and delivered, and also a certain mortgage given by the said grantor to R. S. Bassett, to secure the payment of two hundred and seventy five dollars by the said Stillman Andrews. Said note was given to Adolphus R. Smith and said mortgage was given to R. S. Bassett, and this conveyance shall be void if such payment be made as herein specified. But if default be made in payment, or any part thereof, as above provided, then it shall be lawful for the said party of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, and out of all moneys arising from such sale to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with the costs and charges of making such sale and the attorney's fees for foreclosure, and the overplus if any there be, shall be paid by the party making such sale on demand to the said Stillman Andrews or his heirs or assigns.
