And we the said Richard G. and Mary, our heirs executors and administrators, are held and firmly bound by these presents, in the sum of one Thousand dollars, to the said Charles W. Hunt his heirs and assigns, to make and convey unto him or them all further right or title which shall or may be awarded or conveyed to us, by any authority, or by any person or persons whomsoever.
