Southmayd his heirs executors and administrators to make and convey unto him or them all further right or title which shall or may be awarded or conveyed unto him or them all further rights or title which shall or may be awarded or conveyed to me by any authority or by any officer or person by virtue of a title to the Land either of Lawrence arising from the general land office.
