 To wit: New Number One Hundred Twenty Two (122) containing lots as

 Rhode Island State Seventy Five (75) Louisiana State Two Hundred
 Twenty Five (225) Pennsylvania State Sixty Eight (68) New York State
 One Hundred Thirty Nine (139) Indiana State Two Hundred Twenty Three
 (223) Massachusetts State One Hundred Seventy Three (173) Delaware
 State One Hundred Two (102) and one Hundred Four (104) Mississippi State
 One Hundred Thirty Eight (138) and lots Vermont State Twenty Six
 (26) and N. Hampshire State Thirty Nine (39) To have and to hold the
 aforesaid premises with all the privileges and appurtenances
 thereto belonging unto the said party of the second part, so that
 neither we said Parties, our heirs or assigns, or any person claim-
 ing by, from or under us or them, shall have any right, title in-
 terest, claim, or demand in or to the aforesaid premises or any part
 thereof, and we hereby Covenant and agree to warrant and defend
 against all persons claiming any right title or interest under
 the said Parties, their heirs or assigns - And further this
 Indenture Witnesseth that the said Samuel S. Jengler Esq. Governor
 John P. Woz William West Cykins and George West Chinnans and
 their Successors are held and firmly bound unto the said John
 C. Archibald in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars to be paid
 unto the said John C. Archibald his heirs or assigns to whom
 payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves and our
 Successors by these presents. Now the Condition of this obligation
 is such that if upon the payment by the said party of the
 second part of all taxes lawfully assessed upon the aforesaid pre-
 mises the said parties of the first part, or their Successors shall
 make and deliver unto the said party of the second part
 his heirs or assigns a good and valid deed with the usual
 Covenants for conveyances in fee simple whenever a patent
 for the same title of Kansas shall issue from Congress unto
 one Robert Roberts or William West Cykins and be conveyed
 unto the aforesaid Parties then this obligation shall be
 void and of no effect otherwise to remain in full force
