 we the said constituents if present ought, or might personally attorney
 the matter should require, more special authority than is herein compre-
 ssed. We the said constituents ratifying, allowing and holding firm
 and valid all and whatsoever our said Attorney shall lawfully
 do or cause to be done, in and about the premises, by virtue of the
