 the first part for his heirs administrators and assigns
 doth covenant and agree to and with the party of
 the second part his heirs, administrators and assigns that
 he hath not done or suffered any act or thing whereby
 the above described premises lands or town lots or any part
 thereof now or at any time hereafter shall be bar,
 gained conveyed or encumbered in any manner whatsoever
 And furthermore that the aforesaid party of the first part
 is held and firmly bound unto the said party of the
 second part his heirs executors administrators and assigns
 in the sum of Three thousand Dollars (\$3000.) to be
 paid unto the said party of the second part his heirs
 executors administrators or assigns to which payment well
 and truly to be made he binds himself his heirs executors
 administrators and assigns by these Presents - The condition
 of this obligation being such however that if the said
 party of the first part his heirs executors administrators
 or assigns shall convey unto the said party of the second
 part his heirs executors administrators and assigns
 whatever further title may or shall hereafter accrue
 to the said party of the first in the above described lands
 and town lot lots directly or indirectly from the Land
 office of Washington or the Trustees of the town of Lawrence
 or from any other source whatsoever at such time as
 said further title shall to said party accrue, then
 this obligation shall be wholly void and of no effect
 otherwise to remain in full force. And furthermore
 this instrument witnesseth that the conveyance herein
 before made and being given by the party of the first
 part to the party of the second part aforesaid, is inten-
 ded as a mortgage to secure the payment of three several
 promissory notes executed by Whitman & Seal of the
 Town of Lawrence Territory of Kansas to Samuel
 G. Howe dated May 27. 1854 for the sum of three
 hundred and ninety two Dollars (\$392) payable on
 1855
