

Know all men by these presents That I George W. Cambell of Hampden
 Coffey County, Territory of Kansas for and in consideration of
 two hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by George W. Col
 lamore of Lawrence in the said Territory, Counsellor at law
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged do hereby give grant bargain
 sell and convey unto the said Collamore his heirs and assigns a certain
 piece or parcel of land situate in Lawrence aforesaid with the build
 ing thereon standing and described as follows; to wit, One piece
 Parcel or lot of land situated on Kentucky Street and numbered
 on said Street fifty five (No 55) with all the privileges and
 appurtenances thereunto belonging. Said lot is shown on a
 plat of said Lawrence according to a survey made by A. D. Searl
 made in the year of our Lord 1854 and on said plat is numbered
 fifty five on said Kentucky Street being the same premises
 that I purchased of W. H. R. Lykins and conveyed from him
 to me by deed, dated March 2nd A.D. 1853.

To have and to hold the above released premises to the said Collamore
 and his heirs and assigns to him and their use and behoof forever. And
 I the said Geo. W. Cambell for myself and my heirs executors
 and administrators do covenant with the said Collamore his heirs
 and assigns that the said premises are free from all encumbrances
 made or suffered by me; And that I will and my heirs executors
 and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said
 Collamore and his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful
 claims and demands of all persons.
