


Know all men by the presents That I Joseph L Speer of the City of Lawrence, Territory of Kansas, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars, to me in hand paid by Dr J Leiby of the same place the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold, and quit claimed, and by these presents do bargain sell, and quit claim, unto the said Dr J. Leiby his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, forever, all my right, title, interest, claim and demand in and to the following described land, situate and lying in the City of Lawrence, in the Territory of Kansas, according to the survey made A. D. 1854, to wit, No seventeen (17) New Jersey Street, Eighty five New York Street, Mississippi Two hundred and thirty three, (233) and two hundred and thirty five, (235). And I Joseph L Speer aforesaid, my heirs, executors administrators and assigns, are held and firmly bound by these presents in the sum of Two hundred dollars, to the said Dr J Leiby aforesaid his heirs executors, administrators and assigns, to well and truly make over and convey unto him or them all the title which I shall receive from the Trustees of the said City of Lawrence, or from any person or persons whomsoever, to any and all of the above described property. To have and To hold, the same, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging, forever.
