

said Albert P. Dawson his heirs and assigns forever. And the said
Elliott H. Benton for himself and his heirs do covenant executors
and administrators, do covenant with the said Albert P. Dawson his
heirs and assigns, that the said premises are free from all encumbrances
made or suffered by me; that I have full right and power to sell, convey
and quit claim the same, and that I shall and will warrant and
defend the same unto the said Albert P. Dawson his heirs and
assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons
claiming by through or under me but against none other
