To have and to hold the above released premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Bishop his heirs and assigns forever, so that neither they, the said Company nor any person or persons claiming from or under them, in the name, right, or stead of them, — shall or will, by any way or means, have claims or demand any right or title to the aforesaid Premises, or their appurtenances, or to any part or parcel thereof forced. That they will Warrant and defend the same from all incumbrance so far as made by, through or under them, but not otherwise.
