

Know all men by these presents; That John Ingesson and Johanna his wife of Lawrence in the Territory of Kansas for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars, to us in hand paid by Henry Biebush of the same place the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained sold and quit claimed, and by these presents do bargain sell and quit claim unto the said Henry Biebush and to his heirs and assigns forever, all our right title estate interest claim and demand, in possession or expectancy of, in and to the following described land situated in the city of Lawrence Kansas Territory to wit Lot No Thirty nine (39) New York It is described on the map and Survey made by A. D. Saul A. D. 1854. To have and to hold the above described premises with the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the said Henry Biebush his heirs and assigns forever. And we the said John Ingesson & Johanna Ingesson for ourselves and our heirs executors and administrators do covenant with the said Henry Biebush his heirs and assigns that the said premises are free from all encumbrances made or suffered by us; that we have full right and power to sell convey and quit claim the same, and that we shall and will warrant and defend the same unto the said Henry Biebush his heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all personz claiming by through or under us but against none other.

And the said John Ingesson Johanna Ingesson our heirs executors and administrators are held and firmly bound by these presents in the sum of Two Hundred dollars, to the said Henry Biebush his heirs and assigns to make and convey unto him or them all further right or title which shall or may be awarded or conveyed to us by any authority or by any person or persons whomsoever.
