I now all men by these presents, know wherefore George Shearer at the April Term A.D. 1859, of the Second District Court of Kansas Territory sitting in and for the County of Douglas, for the trial of causes arising under the laws of the Territory recovered a judgment in said Court against Samuel Fry & Charles Free man, now for the sum of Eight hundred and thirty seven <sup>5</sup>/<sub>100</sub> dollars his debt and damages, and also the further sum of Thirteen <sup>90</sup>/<sub>100</sub> dollars costs of suit, and whereas
