

Convey for our selves and heirs, executors and administrators, do covenant with the said New England Emigrant Aid Company their successors and assigns, that the said premises are free from all encumbrances made or suffered by us, that we have full right and power to sell, convey and quit-claim the same, and that we shall and will Warrant and Defend the same unto the said New England Emigrant Aid Company their successors and assigns forever, against the lawful claim and demands of all persons claiming by, through or under us but against none other. And we the said Martin F. Conway and Emily F. Conway our heirs, executors and administrators, are held and firmly bound by these presents in the sum of ten dollars to the said New England Emigrant Aid Company their successors and assigns, to make and convey unto them or them all further right title which shall or may be awarded or conveyed to us by any authority or by any person or persons, by virtue of a bill to the townsite of Lawrence aforesaid issuing from the general Land Office.
