ces made or suffered by me; that we have full right and power to sell  
convey and quit claim the same and that we shall and will warrant  
and defend the same unto the said Bronson his heirs and assigns  
forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons claiming  
by, through or under us but against none other.

And I the said Zerah Nichols and wife our heirs, execu-  
tors and administrators, are held and firmly bound by these presents  
in the sum of one hundred dollars, to the said Bronson  
his heirs and assigns, to make and convey unto him or them  
all further right or title which shall or may be awarded or  
may be awarded or conveyed to us by any authority, or by any person  
or persons.
