C. W. McAllister his heirs and assigns forever, against the law-
ful claims and demands of all persons claiming by through or
under us, but against none other. And we the said Rufus S. &
Elizabeth our heirs, executors and administrators, are held and
firmly bound by these presents, in the sum of two hundred dollars
to the said C. W. McAllister his heirs and assigns, to make and
convey unto him or them all further right or title which shall or may
be awarded or conveyed to us by any authority or by any person or per-
sons, by virtue of a title to the town site of Lawrence aforesaid issuing
from the general Land Office.
