And we the said Charles H. Branscomb and Georgie J. Branscomb and our heirs executors and administrators are held and firmly bound by these presents in the sum of Six hundred dollars to the said Arabella Bissell her heirs and assigns to make and convey unto her or them all further right or title which shall or may be awarded or conveyed to us by any authority or by any person or persons by virtue of a title to the town site of Lawrence aforesaid issuing from the general land office.
