

Know all men by these presents. That Whereas W. D. Blackford at the October Term. A.D. 1860. of the District Court, sitting in and for the County of Douglas, for the trial of causes arising under the laws of the Territory, recovered a judgment in said Court against Joseph S. Moore. A. A. Moore & J. Moore for the Sum of Ninety Seven and ten ⁰⁰/₁₀₀ dollars debt and damages, together with the sum of ⁰⁰/₁₀₀ dollars costs of suit herein: And whereas the said W. D. Blackford did afterwards, to wit: on the 24th day of May A.D. 1859, send out of the Clerk's Office of the said Court an Execution on the said judgment of that date, directed to the Sheriff of the said County of Douglas, commanding him to make the amount of the said judgment and costs of the goods and chattels of the said Joseph S. Moore. A. A. Moore and J. Moore and for want of their land and tenements, which Execution duly came to the hands of Samuel Walker Sheriff of Douglas County, to be executed, and such proceedings were legally had on said execution that afterwards, to wit, on the 27th day of June A.D. 1859 the said Samuel Walker as such Sheriff, and by virtue of said Execution, duly offered at public auction the land and tenements hereinafter described, levied upon, on said execution, as the property of the said Joseph S. Moore. A. A. Moore & J. Moore having first giving notice of the time and place of said sale, by advertisement published more than thirty day prior thereto to

a newspaper printed in said county of Douglas and then sold the same to W. D. Blackford for the Sum of Seventy Six Dollars which sale was duly returned to the said Court, and by the said Court, at its May Term A.D. 1860, examined and confirmed, and the said Samuel Walker as such Sheriff, ordered to convey the said Land and tenements, so as aforesaid sold to
