It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the Board ask for bids to paint the following surfaces at Valleyview Rest Home. The exterior of all wardrobe and cabinets which have been previously painted; also the inside of the above described wardrobe or cabinet doors. All interior windows. All interior steel door frames. All door frames shall be washed with a prefix solution before new paint is applied. New paint to be applied under this contract is to match in color the paint which is being or will have been applied under a previous painting contract awarded by the Board of County Commissioners on May 8, 1968.

PURCHASE: FOLDING CHAIRS It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that Lawrence Typewriter Company be awarded a contract to provide 50 VIRC0 #167 folding chairs, color Suntan at \$4.19 per unit, FOB the Court House. Motion carried unanimously.

DAY CAMP

The Board received a letter from Frances Degen Horowitz, PH.D. Chairman of the Day Camp Advisory Board concerning the Fairgrounds Community Day Camp activities for the summer of 1968.

It was moved by Mr. Kampschroeder and seconded by Mr. Booth that when not previously engaged, that portion of the Douglas County 4-H Fairgrounds not a part of the building area shall be made available Monday through Friday for use of the Fairgrounds Community Day Camp activities under the following limitations and conditions. The Camp may have use of the judging pavillion except for days when there are previously scheduled activities. The advisory Board of the Fairgrounds Community Day Camp shall furnish to the Douglas County Clerk proof of liability insurance in the minimum amounts of \$10,000 property damage and \$50,000 bodily injury prior to the commencement of activities. The Board of County Commissioners will furnish four (4) portable toilets to be located as requested by the Director for temporary use of the children participating in the Day Camp. Motion carried unanimously.

APPROVE PLATTING

It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the Board approve the portion of the Planning Commission minutes of April 25, 1968 as pertains to the H. D. Rothrock request for platting, subject to the planning commissions recommendations for an established property line 40 feet from the center line of the roadway. Motion carried unanimously.
