Letter advised that the appointment was somewhat premature and they requested no appointment be made until after January 1, 1969 It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the appointment dated June 18, be rescinded and that no appointment for the position of County Reservoir Sanitation Officer be made until after January 1, 1969 and further that Dr. Clinton be advised.
