

IT IS FURTHER FOUND, DETERMINED, RESOLVED, AND ORDERED, that Sub-sewer District No. 1, of Wakarusa Main Benefit Sewer District No. 10, Douglas County, Kansas, through its Governing Body, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, shall hold another special session to hear any complaints that may be made as to the apportionment of costs and that such hearing shall be held at 11:00 o'clock A. M., September 23, 1968, at the offices of the Board of County Commissioners in the Douglas County Court House, at Lawrence, Kansas, and that this Resolution be published for two consecutive weeks in the official County Paper.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, mail a written or printed notice to the owner or owners of each of the tracts of land in the district liable for special assessments, whose names and addresses can be obtained from County Records, which notice shall set forth the time for hearing complaints, the amount assessed against each tract of land within said Sub-sewer District, and that if any such assessment on said Tracts of land are not paid in full within thirty days from the 23 day of September, 1968, Bonds of said County will be issued in the amount therefore, and such unpaid assessments will be spread upon the Tax Rolls in twenty (20) equal annual installments to include interest on deferred payments at the rate per annum not exceeding that authorized by K.S.A. Chapter 10, and all Acts Amendatory thereto.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that this Resolution be published in the official County Paper of Douglas County, Kansas, and that notices referred to here and above shall be mailed such property owners at least two weeks prior to the time of hearing complaints, if any.




