*Fairgrounds Building
 KS Steel Built, Inc.*

It was moved by Mr. Heck that the final acceptance of the contract with Kansas Steel Built, Inc. in the amount of \$12,384 covering the roof structure, doors, windows, and steel paneling of a 70' x 80' building constructed at the 4-H Fairgrounds be approved. Motion was seconded by Mr. Ice and carried unanimously.

*Possible widening of
 Damaged Turnpike Bridge*

Mr. Don Venhaus, Assistant City Manager; George Williams, Public Works Director; L. D. Rice, County Engineer, and John Frazier discussed the possibility of expanding the bridge across the Turnpike on Iowa Street which was damaged. It was moved by Mr. Heck that the Board advise the Turnpike Authority to proceed with the repair of the bridge. Investigation has shown that it would not be practical to consider widening it at this time. Motion was seconded by Mr. Ice and carried unanimously.
