*BIDS FOR COUNTY
SURPLUS SCHOOL SUPPLIES*

It was moved by Mr. Heck and seconded by Mr. Ice that the Board request the County Superintendent of Schools to ask for bids from the four school districts operating within Douglas County on the surplus film strips held by the County Superintendent of Schools. Bids to be received on the various categories of film strips by grade level, high school, primary, and elementary. The bids also to include film cases, film projector, the Heart Model and the New Math Series Set; all items which are presently under the control of the County Superintendent of Schools. These bids are to be received by March 1, 1969. Motion carried unanimously.

Request Road
