Mrs. Cerf was referred to the Probate Court as the source for starting any necessary action.

Weeds Turnipize The Board received a letter from the Kansas Turnpike Authority assuring their cooperation in the eradication of the noxious weeds adjacent to the Kansas Turnpike throughout Douglas County.

TAX PROTEST The Board received a copy of a letter from Mr. Walter J. Kennedy, Kansas City, Missouri, and a copy of a tax protest statement covering the real and personal property of Alpha Kappa Lambda Building Association and the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternal Association. Both protests covering the second half of the 1968 tax.
