Alexander of the second project Office - Overbrook, Kansas The Board received the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission Minutes of the Baldwini request Commissioners accept the minutes of the meeting of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission with regard to the application of the City of Baldwin for a following changes to the terminations of the Planning Commission for a sanitary landfill. The recommendations of the Planning Board are accepted with the following changes to the fence requirements. The fence shall be of 5 foot height construction and of a material sufficient to afford satisfactory protection from the blowing of materials from the dump. The fence is to be installed on all sides of the fill area which are adjacent to land held in ownership by other than the lessor. The City of Baldwin is responsible to control the blowing of trash in all directions. Motion was seconded by Mr. Ice and carried unanimously.

Requests of hising As of today, the Wakaruse Drainage Board consisting of Mr. William R. Meairs, Mrs. Board concerning further discussion with the Watershed engineers and advised that the proposed plan Wakarusa Abtulkulof the projected floodway parallel to Louisiana Street on the East side appeared Iloodway Project to be satisfactory with them and requested only the following two considerations.

- 1. That the Board of County Commissioners do everything within their power to use the majority of the excavated material from the floodway in the construction of the relocated east-west road.
- 2. That adequate ditching be installed on both sides of the new projected east-west road to assist in the removal of run off water from the North in an easternly. direction to the Wakarusa River.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on August 1, 1969.
