Discussion with Pres. of Black Jack Historical Society.

Mr. P. W. Jones, President of Black Jack Historical Society, appeared before the Board to present a map showing the proposed improvements of the Black Jack Historical Park. The Board suggested to Mr. Jones that a very conscientious diligent effort be made to combine the efforts of the Black Jack Historical Society and the Santa Fe Historical Society. Both of these societies are concentrated in the same general area of the County.

Purchase adding machine

It was moved by Mr. Ice and seconded by Mr. Heck that the County Treasurer be authorized to purchase a Monroe Adding Machine for a cost of \$206.55. Machine to be purchased with funds from the Special Auto Fee Fund. Motion carried.

The Board received from the Kansas Power and Light Company a plan showing the construction of a new 12,470 volt overhead line to replace the line which is presently located on the old Leocompton Bridge which is to be removed. New line will be west of the condemned bridge.

A water sample collected on August 13, 1969, at Lone Star Lake Park and tested by the State Department of Health showed that the water was safe for drinking purposes at the time of testing.

The Board made in inspection trip to the 4-H Fairgrounds.
