*Flory request
for water from
Lone Star Lake*

Mr. John Flory, Route #5, appeared before the Board to discuss the possibility of securing water for his stock from Lone Star Lake. Mr. Flory's farm is in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of 14-18-18, Douglas County, Kansas, immediately adjacent to Lone Star Lake. He presently has a dairy herd of approximately 100 cattle. Mr. Flory presented an abstract showing a warranty deed recorded October 7, 1940, in Book 143, Page 273 in which the County agreed by accepting title to a certain tract of land to clean and maintain a stock pond on this property or else grant water rights to the property owner for water from Lone Star Lake. The matter was referred to the County Attorney for an opinion.

for vote on
Judicial Building*

The Board discussed the proposed judicial building and tentative time schedule for submitting the question to the voters. After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Heck and seconded by Mr. Ice that the question be submitted to the voters of Douglas County for their approval the latter part of November or forepart of December 1969, the exact date to be determined after council with the County Attorney and the County Clerk for proper scheduling of the election. The question as submitted will be to seek approval of the voters to construct a new judicial building to house the County Law Enforcement offices, County Jail, County Courts, District Court, County Attorney, and associated offices connected with the Judicial aspects of the County operations.

In addition, the building would be constructed of adequate size to provide space to be leased to the City of Lawrence for use of the Lawrence Police Department and City of Lawrence municipal Court and associated judicial offices. The building is to be constructed immediately east of the existing County Jail at an anticipated cost of three and one half million dollars. It would be anticipated the building would be completed the latter part of 1971. The new judicial building would replace the existing Sheriff's quarters and County Jail and eliminate the overcrowded conditions in the existing Courthouse which would remain in use for County Administrative Offices. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board met with the Welfare Director.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on September 19, 1969.
