The Planning Commission recommendation was that the plat be approved, subject to the roads meeting County specifications, and re-quested the County Commission to secure an option to purchase the land proposed for Shank Hill Recreational Park prior to or at the time of approval of the plat. Mr. Heck moved we approve the Plat of Shank Hill, the same being an approximate 76.8 acre tract located in the Southeast corner of Section 26-13-19 on U.S. Highway 59; said approval being subject to the final plat meeting all Douglas County road specifications.
