## RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CIVIL DEFENSE ORGANIZATION FOR \_\_\_\_\_\_ Douglas COUNTY. KANSAS.

WHEREAS, the tensions in the international situation are such that the United States could be subject to enemy attack.

WHEREAS, the potential enemy is equipped with offensive weapons and devices, including conventional and nuclear bombs, and possibly chemical and biological agents, which may be It is possible also that the delivered by manned bombers, submarines or ballistic missiles. It is possible also that the United States may be subjected to weapons delivered by clandestine means, therefore, it is deemed necessary and expedient for a Civil Defense organization to be organized for <u>Douglas</u> County, Kansas.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF <u>Douglas</u> COUNTY, KANSAS, that under the provisions of Chapter 48, Civil Defense Act of 1951, as amended, we, the Board of County Commissioners of <u>Douglas</u> County, Kansas, hereby create and establish the <u>Douglas</u> County Commissioners of <u>Douglas</u> County, Kansas, hereby create and establish the <u>Doug</u> County Civil Defense organization to work in a joint effort with the Federal, State and <u>Douglas</u> County/Municipal Civil Defense organizations in the event of a major man-made disaster or in the event of natural disasters, including, but not limited to, hurricanes, tornadoes, windstorms or floods.

And to operate according to the <u>Douglas</u> (county) Civil Defense Plan as approved by the State Civil Defense Office.

And to prepare an annual Program Paper as required by the Office of Civil Defense to Douglas (county) organization to receive federal aid. qualify the

In addition to the other provisions of this resolution any political subdivision within Douglas County may subscribe to this Plan by enacting an appropriate resolution approved by the governing body of such political subdivisions and by so doing will become a legal member of the <u>Douglas</u> County/Municipal Civil Defense organization with joint responsi-bilities and benefits. A special Civil Defense Account will be established in the office of the Treasurer of <u>Douglas</u> County and each subscribing political subdivision may deposit monies in such account, which fund shall be a revolving fund. Funds in this account may be used for, but not limited to:

A. Personnel and Administrative Expense, FCDG, Part F, Chapter 5, Appendix 2

- B. Contributions Equipment Program, FCDG, Part F, Chapter 5, Appendix 1
- C. Surplus Property Program, FCDG, Part F, Chapter 5, Appendix 3
- D. OCD Staff College Program

The executive officials of the <u>Douglas</u> County/Municipal Civil Defense organization will by mutual agreement between themselves and the County Treasurer, and with the consent Douglas County/Municipal Civil Defense organization and cooperation of the County Treasurer, establish the fiscal policies concerning deposits and withdrawals of funds in said account.

Any reimbursement or matching funds from any source whatever shall be deposited in said account and shall be used only for Civil Defense purposes. Withdrawals of funds from this account shall be made on warrants drawn by the <u>Douglas</u> County Auditor and the vouchers shall be signed by the appropriate members of the <u>Douglas</u> Board of County Commissioners and by the <u>Douglas</u> County Civil Defense Director. All withdrawals from this account shall be in accordance with the above mentioned established fiscal policies.

WHEREUPON, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, declares this resolution passed and adopted.
