Bills for The Board received two proposals for the furnishing of approximately 9500 Tons of A.B.-3 road rock for the Douglas County Road and Bridge Department, to be used on the County road road rock, South of U.S. Highway 56, a County road leading to the Franklin County line. One proposal from the Killough-Clark, Inc. of Ottawa, Kansas, at \$1.27 per ton in the stockpile at their Wellsville quarry, located 9 miles from the South end of the project, and a second proposal from Concrete Materials of Topeka, Kansas, of \$1.35 per ton in the stockpile at their quarry which is located 6½ miles North of the North end of the project.
