Board noted receipt from the City of Lawrence of copy of Joint Resolution of the County Commissioners of Douglas Co., Kansas, and of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, authorizing the Mental Health Committee of the Lawrence-Douglas Co. Joint Board of Health to contract to provide mental health services under K.S.A. 1970 Supp. 65-211. It was moved by Mr. Cragan, seconded by Mr. Ice that the Board of County Commissioners adopt this Joint Resolution as County Res. #71-7 this 31st day of March, 1971. Carried unanimously. Mr. Paul Cain appeared before the Board representing the Little League Baseball Assn. of Douglas County, to inquire about the possibilities of their group using the Fairgrounds ball diamond and to what extent our Board would be willing to improve the facilities at the Fairgrounds. Specifically Mr. Cain inquired about lighting, to which the Board indicated the cost would seem prohibitive at this time. The Board did however, indicate they would be willing to expend whatever funds are necessary to improve the present diamond at the Fairgrounds to put it in good playable condition. The Board reiterated to Mr. Cain our policy that use of the diamond would need to be coordinated with the Lawrence Recreation Commission. The Board agreed that any improvements which would be made would be at the recommendation of and approval of the Lawrence Recreation Commission.

The Board made an inspection tour on the afternoon of March 31st, to Lone Star Lake, and the following decisions were made: 1. That the playground equipment purchased to be installed at Lone Star Lake will be placed in the area immediately south of the Girl Scout Building. 2. The report shows permits issued for residences in the amount of \$422,225.00, permits issued for mobile homes, \$42,300.00, permits issued for commercial, \$13,500.00; total estimated value of all permits issued for the first quarter of 1971, \$478,025.00. As a matter of comparison, for the first Quarter of 1970, total permit estimated value, \$264,600. Mr. Kellum's report showed permit fees collected of \$782.50.
