Mr. Laird and Mr. Ward, representing Blue Cross-Blue Shield Health Insurance, visited with the Board concerning various aspects of our present Blue Cross-Blue Shield program. Pertin ent items discussed were relative to present coverage, degree of participation by our employees, and the possibility of county participation in providing partial payment of our em ployees Health Insurance. Mr. Laird and Mr. Ward were requested to advise as soon as possible their best estimate of 1972 per month cost of Blue Cross-Blue Shield coverage.

Sheriff Johnson and Attorney Wes Norwood appeared before the Board to discuss a fee statement presented by Mr. Norwood for services rendered in representing Sheriff Johnson relative to an action filed against Sheriff Johnson in May, 1969. The Board noted the receipt of a letter from Attorney Robert B. Oyler, relative to the Flossie Kincaid Savings and Checking Accounts. Mr. Oyler relates that there is now some \$38,000 in this fund which he indicates he would like see used in some manner to improve Valleyview Rest Home. The Board feels they have need for further information on this matter from Mr. Oyler.

Mr. Owen Turrentine of the State Civil Defense Dept., Mr. H. H. Belote, Douglas County Civil Defense Director, Sheriff Johnson, Under-Sheriff Murphy met with the Board in an afternoon session. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the communications systems presently in operation and used by Douglas County Agencies and Organizations. After considerable discussion it seemed readily apparent that radio communications to the Sheriff's office from outlying areas of the County are very inadequate. Further discussion centered around the advantages and disadvantages of portable and mobile units. It was unanimously agreed that we should at this time take advantage of resources being made available by the State through the Governor's Committee on Criminal Administration.

In summing up agreements reached during the meeting it was agreed the following action shoul be taken:

- 1. That Mr. Belote, Mr. Turrentine and the Sheriff's Dept. will cooperate in request-That Mr. Derote, Mr. Inferminiations frequency, which is presently assigned to Dougla County government, be reassigned to Douglas County Sheriff and law enforcement.
 That application be made to the Governor's Committee on Criminal Administration for
- funds for the purchase of 15 Walkie-Talkie type communications units for law enforce ment surveillance use in Douglas County. Mr. Belote will assist in this application inasmuch as the requested equipment would be available for other emergency uses.
