Both Mr. LaDuke and Mr. Kellum signed damage claim release agreements which are on file in the office of the County Clerk.

Lake
lighting
installation*

Mr. Harry Winters, our concession operator at Lone Star Lake, appeared before the Board to request our consideration of a mercury vapor-lamp to light the concession area and also the possibility of a similar lamp for the playground area. The Board requested Mr. Winters to secure the Kansas, Power & Light Co. proposal for the installation of such lighting and the Board would be willing to consider such a proposal. Mr. Winters related later in the morning to the Board that he had obtained a proposal from K.P. & L. for such lighting. A 400 watt mercury lamp on an already placed pole at the concession area can be installed at a cost to the County of \$6.30 per month on a yearly basis. A second proposal was for lighting of the playground and camping area which would be on the same basis unless a pole needed to be installed. If pole installation is required the cost will be \$1.75 additional per month on a 3 year contract. It was moved by Mr. Cragan, seconded by Mr. Ice that we advise Mr. Winters to proceed to have this installation of lighting made. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mr. Ice; seconded by Mr. Cragan that by Resolution #71-10 that the Board of Douglas County Commissioners hereby declares that part of road #20 lying in Marion Twp. and as described in said Res. and part of road #477, also lying in Marion Twp., and as described in said Res. shall be vacated.
