Purchase lighting fixtures for swine judging arena

Al Skeet, Property Supervisor, appeared before the Board to report that it would be necessary to install lights in the newly constructed swine judging arena, inasmuch as the judging area will be used several times during the evening hours. Mr. Skeet reported the only fixtures he could find in stock were at Stanion Electric at a cost of \$18.40 each, without reflectors. It was moved by Mr. Ice, seconded by Mr. Cragan and carried unanimously that we ask Mr. Skeet to purchase 4 such lighting fixtures with the understanding that we will purchase reflectors when available.

Budget hearing set for Aug. 16

Darlene Hill, Budget Director, appeared before the Board with finalized 1972 budget in line with discussions held with her previously. The budget reflects a total 1972 proposed levy of 28.195 mills based on a total estimated Douglas County valuation. This mill levy will create new monies in the amount of \$3,601,779.17. It is understood that the Douglas County Corporation valuation figure has not been received and the mill levy referred to may be adjusted up or down, depending on the Corporate valuation. It was moved by Mr. Cragan, seconded by Mr. Ice that the proposed budget as received be authorized for legal publication, and the date for hearing on said budget be set for 10:30 a.m. August 16th, in the Commissioners Room. Motion carried unanimously.

Salary adjusted Betty Lieb

Effective August 1st, the monthly salary of Betty Lieb will be adjusted within the various Departments for which she does work as follows: Road & Bridge, \$365.00, Park, \$20.00, Weed, \$10.00 and Fair \$15.00.

Report re Courthouse fire extinguishers

Board noted receipt of a report from the Fire Dept. Bureau of Fire Prevention, relative to the Douglas County Sheriff's office and the Douglas County Courthouse with a notation that the Courthouse fire extinguishers need to be recharged. The reports were turned over to Mr. Al Skeet, Property Supervisor, for his consideration.

Gas payment refundable

Board noted receipt of checks from the Kansas Public Service Co., payable to the Douglas County 4-H Fair as gas payment refunds in the amounts of \$5.67 and \$90.21. The checks were referred to the County Treasurer for deposit.

Board acknowledged receipt of copy of a letter written to Mr. L. D. Rice, County Engineer, from the Engineer of Secondary Roads, notifying his office of final design approval of road #208, and further notifying his office that we may now proceed with right-of-way acquisition.

Sewer Dist. Maintenance budgets hearing Aug. 16

Budget Director, Darlene Hill, appeared before the Board to discuss with the Board mill levy rates to be established for maintenance of the various Sewer Districts of Douglas County. Some changes were made which will be reflected upon the publication of Sewer Dist. Maintenance budget. The Board authorized publication of the Sewer Dist. Statute discussed re. charges for notary service

After discussion of this new Statute with Mrs. Norman, the Board agreed to get Counselor opinion as to proper procedure regarding this Statute. The Statute refers to all County Officers and we will ask the opinion to be in that respect.
