The Board received the petition and advised Mr. Dobbins that the Board would determine the statutory authority in this matter and advise him accordingly. Ensuing conversation with Counselor Young developed the fact that the petition as presented would be incomplete and the Board agreed that the petition should be returned to Mr. Dobbins with a request that the petition be revised to comply with the requirements of KSA 82a-622 and KSA 82a-614.

Board noted receipt of a copy of a letter written by Mr. Earl Van Meter to Nadene Hibdon, Secretary-Treasurer of K.S.H.S.C., thanking that organ-ization for the contribution of \$25 to be expended for improvement at the 4-H Fairgrounds.

County Assessor Rogers appeared before the Board to inform the Board that he had received from the Department of Property Evaluation an official notice or directive that the deadline for filing merchants inventory by in-dividuals and corporations is extended to April 15 of each year beginning with 1972.

The Board approved a letter written by the engineering staff to the engineering division of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers commenting on the plans and specifications relative to the access road from Highway 40 to the Clinton Dam site. The comments basically request that consideration be given to acceleration and deacceleration lanes at the junction of the access road and U. S. Highway 40. The engineering staff also suggested that the shoulder slopes be constructed with a one on four slope rather than one on three and finally the engineering staff request certain assurance of maintaining certain stones, monuments, and markers for the benefit of the County Engineer staff.

Mr. Ernest Coleman, Unified School District No. 497, and Mr. Bettencourt, representing the Kansas Public Employment Program, appeared before the Board to discuss a modification request relative to the above mentioned program. request for any i to discuss a modification request relative to the above mentioned program. Request for any i the modifications requested will be for the employment of Mr. N. R. Fenter γ N.R. The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

Approved the minutes of the meeting of March 6, 1972.

Sheriff Johnson, Marilyn Steele, wife of caretaker Bob Steele, and county surveyor McGee appeared before the Board to finalize the changes and revisions of the rules and regulations relative to Lone Star Lake. It was agreed that the engineering staff would construct a new map of the lake area showing buildings and areas of concern as presently in place. It was further agreed that after proofreading for possible errors in the revisions, that we would ask caretaker Steele to have 6,000 copies of the new regulations printed.

Treasurer Edythe Norman presented the Board the trial balances from her office as of February 29, 1972.

The Board discussed with Engineer Sanderson and Property Supervisor Skeet the improvements which should be made relative to roads and the black top area at the 4-H Fairgrounds. After due discussion it was moved by Mr. Ice and seconded by Mr. Cragan that Engineer Sanderson proceed to rerock with calcium treatment present rock roads at the Fairgrounds and add necessary base to that area presently black topped and that our plan would be to reseal the black top area as weather permitted. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board then discussed the road situation at Broken Arrow Park with Mr. Skeet and Mr. Sanderson. It was agreed to request Engineer Sanderson to treat the road at Broken Arrow Park in the same manner as at the Fairgrounds and further in order to proper delineate the roadway and to keep traffic on the roadway rather than on the park area, that treated guard rail posts should be placed as necessary to accomplish this purpose.
